The upgrade process relies on the value returned, since it uses this directly to determine the new version. This may appear illogical on some level, but it does work. The reason for returning this value instead of a True or 1, etc. has to do with variable scope and lifetime. In this way, even the globaling of \$setup_info inside the function may have little effect on the upgrade process. But, there may be values in this array you would want to use within the function on the

cycle of upgrades, including option
